
Edmonton and Area



FASD Specific Programs and Services

AADAC Enhanced Services for Women

Offers individual assessment and counseling on an outreach basis in Edmonton to pregnant women who want to enter AADAC's network of services.

Bissell Centre- Fetal Alcohol Spectrum of Services

Parent-Child Advocates: provide one-to-one long term supports to pregnant and/or parenting women (aged 16+) and their families who have struggled with the use of alcohol or other substances.

Community Advocates: provide one-to-one, long term support to adults (male and female) who are affected by FASD.

Corrections to Community: A frontline mentor supports Aboriginal female offenders with FASD transition successfully to the community.

Community Educators: present information on Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder and coordinate training to community groups, residents, agencies, systems and schools. Ph: 780-423-2285 ext 132 (Edmonton)

Bosco Homes- Open Arms

A Woman's Path: Mentors provide specific, modified and culturally sensitive interventions to women with FASD who are parenting. Ph: 780-440-0708 ext 294 (Edmonton)

A Man's Journey: An initiative to provide support and advocacy for male inmates referred to the program through the Fort Saskatchewan Correctional Centre who have or are suspected of having FASD.

Canadian FASD Diagnostic and Training Centre

Providing assessment and diagnosis for children and adults with FASD at the centre and though a mobilized unit. Offers educational and team training. Ph: 780-942-2819 (Redwater)

CASA: FASD Family Reno Program

Provides in-home consultations to parents with children who have FASD to increase their knowledge and ability to integrate sensory processing with behavior management strategies.

Catholic Social Services- FASD Programs

Coaching Families: Provides intensive supports for 3-12 months to families with children (under 18) affected by FASD. The program provides caregivers with strategies for adjustment of living conditions, referrals to supports, education and advocacy.

First Steps: Offers mentorship for women who are pregnant or who have recently given birth and have used drugs or alcohol during the pregnancy.

McDaniel Youth Program: Provides support and mentorship to youth ages 13-19 affected by FASD through the development of personalized goals and increased access to groups, recreational activities and other life skills programs.

Step by Step: Provides long term supports through coaching/mentoring/advocating for mothers who have been diagnosed with FASD and who are parenting children (with or without FASD).

Centerpoint Young Offender Program

Assessment services for youth ages 12-17 who have come into conflict with the law, and are mandated for, or are thought to require, assessment/treatment for mental health or behavioral problems.

Elizabeth Fry Society- Girls Empowered and Strong

Provides support and mentorship to girls 13-17 affected by FASD. Focus sessions include: life skills training, sexual education and self esteem course.

Elves Early Education Program

Two classrooms provide early education programming combined with focus groups. A Speech and Language Pathologist and Occupational Therapist provide consultation and collaboration with staff. Individualized educational programming is provided for each child. Program available for children aged 2.5 - 5.5 years with an FASD diagnosis with two severe delays in development or severe behavioral diagnosis.

FASD Clinical Services-Glenrose Rehabilitation Hospital

Multidisciplinary assessment and diagnosis for children and families affected by prenatal exposure to alcohol. The team links with community partners who provide intervention and support services (ages 12 months-17 years 11 months).

Kids Kottage- Respite Program

3C Project- University of Alberta, Fort Saskatchewan Correctional Centre

The 3C Research Project is designed to optimize successful integration of sentenced male offenders at the Fort Saskatchewan Correctional Centre into the community. Participation in the program is voluntary and commences during incarceration and continues upon release into the community. Program provides educational support groups, a diagnostic clinic, transition advocates, connections to appropriate community supports and follow up. Ph: 780-992-5935 (Edmonton)
